Christmas Devotion

MERRY CHRISTMAS!!

What is your favorite Christmas memory? Take time to share with each other your favorite memory from the past years or even something this year.

Read Luke 1:26-28, 2:1-20 Matthew 1:18-25, 2:1-12

If you have a nativity set (that isn't breakable), allow your kids to help you tell the Christmas story using the figures in the nativity set.

Remind your family how an angel came to Mary and Joseph and gave them PEACE by reminding them that God is in control. Call attention to the shepherds and remark how they had JOY when the angels told them that Jesus had been born in Bethlehem. Talk about the wise men's long journey and how they had HOPE that the promise God made had finally come true. Lastly, look at Baby Jesus in the manger and remember how God showed us His LOVE that first Christmas by sending His Son, JESUS to earth so that we can have a relationship with Him.

Each one of these lives were changed when Jesus came to earth. How have your lives been changed by the good news of Jesus? Take time to share what the good news of Jesus has done in your lives.

End your time together in prayer. Thank God for giving us Jesus, the Savior of the world who gives us Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love!

Week 1 **Devotion Guide**

Have you ever had to wait for something big to happen? Maybe it was a trip, game, concert, or even the first day of school. What about Christmas? Are you waiting in excitement for Christmas Day? Imagine you had to wait a year or even your whole life for Christmas Day! God's people had done just that, they anxiously awaited the arrival of the promised Messiah. They knew that God was sending a Savior to earth and had waited with hope for him.

Our song lyrics this week come from the "Oh Holy Night." Read Genesis 3 together. You see, the world had been weary (tired or worn-out) since sin entered. However, throughout the Old Testament, there was Hope. God had a plan, and the Israelites (God's people) trusted in their hope of a promise. The promise of the Messiah, the Light of the world.

Impatiently wanting to do things on their own, wars raging, famine, slavery, and wandering, God's people wondered how long they must wait. But, God kept his promise, even giving prophets the words to speak, promising again and again: the Light will come.

Read Isaiah 9:2.

Hundreds of years before Jesus was born, the prophet Isaiah spoke words of hope for the coming of a Light, this Light would be Jesus.

Read John 8:12.

Jesus is the Light of the World. We don't have to sit in darkness anymore, waiting. We have our Hope now, and His name is Jesus. He offers us eternal Hope when we decide to follow Him. Jesus came to bring light and hope to a weary world.

Even in this weary world, we can rejoice with Hope because of Jesus, the Light of the World! We can share that light and hope with others.

How can you show others that you love them? How have others shown you love? As we get closer to Christmas, we can remember how God showed His love for us. Do you know how He showed us love?

Read Romans 3:23 & 6:23
